





HISTORY OF K I SAWYER

In 1954 the government entered into negotiations with Marquette County for the lease of the space for a new Air Force base. After several months of meetings and negotiations, a 99-year lease was signed on January 24, 1955, and construction started almost immediately.

Approximately 850 people were employed during the construction and several local contractors were involved.

On January 24,1956, Lieutenant Colonel Robert L. Blocklehurst became the first commander of the newly named K.I. Sawyer **Air Force Base.** The runway was completed in 1957 and in 1958 25 F-102 aircraft were sent on a temporary assignment from Kinross air force base in Sault Ste. Marie to operate out of K. I. Sawyer for several months, while the runways in Kinchelo air force base were being repaired and extended.

The 62nd F1S from O'Hare airport in Chicago was transferred to K.I. Sawyer and became an operational F-101 "Voodoo" squadron in 1959 after the runways at K. I. Sawyer were extended to







12,300 feet.

Shortly after, the Strategic Air Command (SAC) became operational as a tenant unit with the assignment of a KC-135 Air Refueling Squadron that was soon was replaced by the 46th Air Refueling Squadron. The first B-52H arrived at K. I. Sawyer in August 1961 along with the 410th **Bomb** Wing.

The Sault Ste. Marie Air Defense Sector **(SAGE)** continued in operation until September 1963 and in January 1964 control of the base was passed from the Air Defense Command to the Strategic Air Command, leaving the 410 Bomb Wing as the host unit.

The F101equipped 62 Fighter Interceptor Squadron remained at K. I. Sawyer as a tenant unit until April 1971 when it was deactivated and replaced by the 87th Fighter Interceptor Squadron and its F-106 Delta Dart aircraft that were transferred from Duluth Municipal Airport in Minnesota. The 87th F1S was deactivated, and the F-106 aircraft left in 1985.

The last aircraft assigned to K. I. Sawyer were six T-37 jet trainers of the 71FTW assigned to "Accelerated Copilot enrichment Program" in 1977.

The last B-52 left in November of 1994. OnJune 1, 1995, an air force Inactivation Ceremony was held. By August of the same year, the Base Deactivation Ceremony was held.

K. I. Sawyer was closed on September 30, 1995. Chief Master Sergeant Vaughn Stewart, the last military member, left in December 1996.

By September 25, 1999, air carrier passengers were entering and leaving from K. I. Sawyer (now known locally as "Sawyer"). A new terminal building was completed by September 25, 1999, and is next to one of the longest runways in North America. Located on the original airport site picked by Marquette County's first road commission superintendent, Kenneth I. Sawyer, the new airport is ideally positioned for serving the central Upper Peninsula.

Sawyer International Airport is one of 12 airports nationwide that competed for and was selected for inclusion in a special funding category created by the U.S. Congress. As part of the military airports program, the airport received special federal funding.

K. I. Sawyer is home to many residents, both permanent and renting. The street names have remained the same as they were when the Air Force was here, and the military buildings are changing to businesses, but now civilians live, work and play in Sawyer.

AREA TRANSPORTATION

MarqTran

Marquette County Transit Authority (MarqTran) provides bus transportation throughout Marquette County 365 days per year. There are nine fixed routes that run Monday through Saturday, with slightly changed routes on Saturday and Sunday.

MargTran also provides a door-to-door service with the following notice requirements:

- Up to seven days in advance for persons that are ADA-Paratransit eligible
- Up to three days in advance for all persons for medical and dental appointments
- Up to two days in advance for seniors who need arrangements to go to work
- One day in advance for all others


Senior citizens (60 years or older), students (K through 12 and college students with a valid student ID), veterans with valid ID, and people with disabilities ride for half fare. Preschool children ride free of charge with a paying adult.

Tickets, monthly passes, and quarterly passes are available for purchase at the Marq-Tran station in Marquette.
